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Maths Challenge Success!

We were delighted this term to win the Ruthin Junior Maths Challenge for the 4th year in a row, this year winning both 1st and 2nd places! Our two teams of 3 from Form VI battled against 24 other teams from 16 schools over a series of mathematical exercises, including sequences, a crossnumber, a mathematical treasure hunt and the make-or-break maths relay round, with the teams racing to answer as many questions as possible in the time left. The Form VI teams excelled throughout the day and, much to our delight, Joshua, Lily and Giovanni gained 2nd place, winning £25 vouchers each and Sam, Dhyan and William were announced as the overall winners, given vouchers worth £30 each and winning a laptop for the school!

Roaming Romans

Form IV visited the Grosvenor Museum. Chester, to learn about Roman Life. When we arrived, we were given silver body armour to wear and a large, yellow Roman shield to carry. Then we were led by a Roman soldier called 'Titus' to the remains of the historic Roman amphitheatre. We learnt about how the soldiers fought and defended themselves and carried out drills, including the diamond wedge attacking formation, over the knee punches and stab steps. On the way back to the museum, we chanted a Latin Roman Marching song called 'Sin Dex Sin'. We looked around two of the museum's galleries where there were many interesting exhibits of artefacts and interactive activities. We completed worksheets and drew sketches of Chester's Roman Fortress called Deva.

After lunch, we took part in a Roman workshop, where we learnt about artefacts that archaeologists have discovered and why the Romans decided to settle in Deva. We took part in practical activities about the Roman bath houses and dressed up as Roman slaves as we learnt about herbs and spices used in Roman kitchens.





May Day

Each year we all look forward to the May Day bank holiday and anticipation of sunny weather to come. This year in our May Day assembly we talked about the spring months, spring flowers and identified some bird calls. We finished the assembly with a Maypole dance by children of KG and Form I.
