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Exploring Culture at the Jewish Museum

Form V spent a fascinating day at the Manchester Jewish Museum this half-term. Housed in a former Synagogue, with beautiful, stained glass windows, the museum brought the Jewish religion to life for the children. The day was spent carrying out a number of activities which gave further insight into Judaism. The children had the chance to dress up ready for worship, wearing the Tallit (prayer shawl) Kippah

(skull cap) and Teffilin (boxes worn on the head and arm) and carrying the holy book, the Torah. They also learned some of the things Jews can and can not do on the Sabbath - including not switching on any electricity, something which elicited the cry "What no X-Box ?!" Finally they listened to the story of the Passover and joined in with illustrating the Plagues of Egypt - this time using only plastic animals!
