# Elwy Expedition

As part of their geography studies, Form IV took a trip to the River Elwy this half term. Accompanied by Mrs. Bult, Mr. Perkins, Trix and Shadow, Form IV were inspired by the wooden animal carvings along the river to find out more about the types of wildlife to be found in and around the Elwy. They visited the monument erected to remind us of the devastating flooding in November 2012, learnt about the flood plain and flood defences and undertook experiments to measure the speed of the river.

# Infinity & Beyond

Kindergarten have been in outer Space this half term, finding out about space rocket launches and moon landings. There are some budding astronauts willing to take off into outer space encountering aliens on the way! The space theme continued in our number work, matching numbered rockets to their astronauts. The children also had the chance to explore moon sand whilst practising their letters.





## Exploring the Synagogue

Form V had their study of world religions enriched by a fascinating visit to the Manchester Jewish Museum this term. The museum is housed in a former Synagogue and as well as looking at the exhibits, the children enjoyed a 2 hour workshop with the Rabbi in which they learnt what goes on in a Synagogue and what Jews are allowed and not allowed to do on the Sabbath. They were interested to find out that the synagogue is a meeting house, used for many things in addition to services and had the opportunity to dress up for attendance at prayer. Some

children were a little shocked to learn that playing on an X-Box and Play station was not allowed on the Sabbath!





# Bodelwyddan Castle Adventure

Earlier this term. Forms II and III went on an educational visit to Bodelwyddan Castle. Form II had an informative tour of the castle with the housekeeper, Mrs. Humphreys. This supported their learning in their recent history topic, The Victorians. The children got to dress up as ladies, gentlemen, maids and servants and took part in several workshops, including: washday, afternoon tea and games in the billiard room.



Form III took part in an outdoor workshop entitled 'Minibeasts', supporting their learning about plants and animals. They had the opportunity to search for creatures, in a specially adapted area, purpose built to encourage a variety of mini beasts, in the castle grounds. After lunch both classes joined to take a tour of the grounds, including: the maize, bird hide and adventure playground. It was a fantastic day, thoroughly enjoyed by all!



### Rock'n' Roll Panto

As the end of term approached, excitement was at fever pitch! Never more so than on Christmas Party day when children from KG to Form III came to school in party clothes ready to meet Santa Claus, eat party food and play party games.
