Once again, Form VII have performed fantastically well with a full 100% success in all entrance exams - Ruthin, King's, Queen's, Grammar Schools, Rydal Pehrhos, and Myddleton College. The pupils have gained 8 of the 10 Scholarships awarded at Ruthin School, 2 Queen's Scholarships and 7 scholarships to Myddleton College. A fantastic effort from all our Form VII pupils. Congratulations both to the children and to Mrs. Hall for guiding them all through the process so fearlessly!
