# Djembe Drumming

In Music Literacy lessons this term we have been embracing the music of Africa and utilising the djembe drums which have arrived as part of our 'Lion King Experience' resources. Pupils have learnt that the djembe drum can produce more than one sound or tone and how to produce these with their palms on different parts of the drum. We have learnt some accompanying rhythmic patterns used in the show.
