Firstly, they were presented with a number of maths questions to be answered sequentially, the answer to each question leading to the next. Second was a crossnumber puzzle with a point for each correct answer. This was followed by a "treasure hunt" with the teams and their accompanying 6th formers rushing around the school to find clues to maths problems. After lunch, with the hat-trick hanging in the balance, there was a final maths relay round with the teams racing to answer as many questions as possible in the time left. Navneet, Krish and Leah excelled in this round and, much to our delight, were announced as the overall winners.

Ringing the Changes

Form IV visited St. Asaph Cathedral, as part of their R.E. and history topics. They learnt about the many special objects and features inside the Cathedral and made careful observations of the 'Translators Memorial' outside in the Cathedral grounds. The children dressed up as monks, priests, deacons and bishops and performed a drama role play activity based on St. Asaph and St. Kentigern. The pupils then designed and coloured their own stained-glass windows.

After a picnic lunch, the children listened to various notes played on the organ and a variety





of tunes using the fifty-four stops.

Next, they discovered the many secrets and symbols relating to the interior of the Cathedral as they undertook the 'Cathedral Trail' and also took the opportunity to look at William Morgan's translation of the Bible from Hebrew into Welsh.

Finally, in groups, the children played some beautiful scales together using hand bells. This proved to be the highlight of the whole trip.
