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#### Maths Challenge at Ruthin

On Friday 27th April, 100 year 5 pupils from the local area attended a Mathematics Challenge Day organised by Ruthin School. Pupils came from some 20 schools and Fairholme was represented by the dream team of three, Enya, Austin and Reuben from Form VI. They took part in a four round challenge. The Group round involved problem solving whilst the Go Shopping activity involved working closely as a team, sorting out clues logically. Next was orienteering in the grounds and inside the school answering many observational questions on such topics as triple jump, athletics tracks, football pitches and Ruthin school memorabilia, all linked to Mathematics. The final

round was held in the sports hall and was a mathematical relay race. Although the Fairholme team were not the eventual winners, we were very pleased to attend and our team very much enjoyed the experience which certainly made maths fun.

### Roaming Through Chester

During the summer term, Form IV study the Romans. As an introduction to the topic, we organised an educational visit to the Grosvenor Museum, Chester. The weather wasn't looking promising as we set off but fortunately it stayed dry just long enough for us to take a tour around

Chester. led bv а 'Roman Soldier' who explained how the Romans built Deva Fortress and what they used to get up to inside the walls. We visited the amphitheatre and learned some useful moves to defend ourselves against enemies. On returning to the museum we had a chance to explore the Roman exhibits on display and find out more about how the Romans used to live. After lunch we took part in a Roman workshop where we pretended to be archaeologists, looked at Roman architecture and cooked up a feast in a Roman kitchen!

#### Diamond Jubilee Timeline

Pupils have made a huge effort creating posters to tell us important events which took place in each of the 60 years of Queen Elizabeth II's reign. The money raised during Christian Aid Week will be sent to support farmers in the village of Gbap. Thank you all for your kind contributions.

#### Enrichment

We have extended enrichment clubs this term to include 'Techno-Triumphs' - a design and technology club who are currently looking at wind-turbine designs, 'Kobo-Klassics' - a club enjoying our latest gadgets, e-readers, and discovering more simplified works of Shakespeare and 'Band Bandits' - a very noisy club producing a rap version of the classic song 'We built this City' to celebrate City Status in St. Asaph. 'Looney Linguists' have enjoyed an outdoor cafe this term and 'Dramatic Dilemmas' produced a thought provoking drama assembly about the benefits of sharing!

## Baisakhi

One of our multi-cultural assemblies this term focussed on the Sikh festival of 'Baisakhi'. Drama enthusiasts from Form VII acted out the story of the 10th Sikh Guru, Guru Gobind Singh and his quest to find a man to 'Die for God and the Guru'. Whilst none of us at the moment are Sikhs, our assembly focussed





on the idea that we are all equal and equally loved by God.

It is interesting for the children to learn about stories from various faiths and by studying the main six religions, we hope to learn to respect each other's beliefs and live, work and play together happily.

#### Trip to the Post Box!

Kindergarten have been beating a regular trail to the post box as they learn how letters are written, transported and delivered. Letters and cards have been arriving in the special post box in Kindergarten, bringing news from parents and teachers for the children to share, read and enjoy. Along with other classes, as part of the Jubilee activities, the children have designed their own stamps.



#### Road Safety Rap



Our Road Safety Officers this term have been working hard organising our latest Road Safety competition. This time, the aim is to write a rap which promotes care on the roads. One of our assemblies discussed issues that should be taken into account when on or near roads and a rap demonstration team showed us how a rap should go! Children are now practising raps in the playground; entries need to be in soon after half term.

#### Tudor Trails and Trials

The Tudor Period came alive for Form VI on their enrichment visit to Chester. The day started with a practical workshop conducted by Grosvenor Museum staff at the Cathedral. The children undertook a range of activities including writing with quill pens, identifying Tudor artefacts, creating herb mixtures and dressing in period costume. Mrs. Hall then conducted a fascinating tour of the centre of Chester, pointing out Tudor buildings and landmarks. After lunch in the Cathedral gardens, the group were engaged on an exercise in medieval justice involving a visit to the consistory court, and writing letters to a farmer accused in court of not attending church! After a busy day, there was, of course, a chance to purchase gifts before returning to St. Asaph!



#### Visit from King's

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We were very pleased to welcome Chris Ramsey, Headmaster of King's School, Chester, for a tour of Fairholme earlier this term. He was delighted with all our school developments and progress since his last visit, some years ago and pleased that Fairholme is going from strength to strength. Following an enthusiastic meeting with our Form VII pupils, it is clear that the link between our schools is stronger than ever, reinforced by the increasing numbers of our pupils choosing King's as their secondary school.
